### **APPENDIX B**

#### Houston Community Council Chairman's Report 15 June 2016

- 1. We were successful in being awarded grants from the LAC for £6,000 and £5,000 respectively for our flower displays and Christmas lights.
- 2. Our bottle stall at the Houston Agricultural Show raised £394.60 for community council funds. This included £20.00 donation from Jason at the Fox and Hounds / River Inn and a Mrs McLennan who handed £10.00 to Jake as a thank you for removing rubbish. Have delivered thank you cards to Mrs McLennan and all local businesses that contributed.
- 3. The out of action street lights in the village centre have now been repaired.
- 4. Emailed Renfrewshire Council about lack of action on clearing blocked drains 3 months after initially reporting them. The customer service advisor responded saying that she had forwarded the email to the Service Co-ordination Manager, but since I have had no response I've had to email again asking for his or her name so that I can contact them directly.
- 5. Have spoken to Renfrewshire Council Roads Department and the chairmen of Locher and Gryfebank Residents' Associations with a view to setting up a meeting. Have also emailed RC Roads Dept suggesting dates for a site visit and a meeting with residents. Nothing heard. Reminder sent.
- 6. Along with Jake Fulton I had a very fruitful meeting with Dr. Kate Cuthbert, RC Outdoor Access Officer. She agreed with our plan to investigate a joint project with Bridge of Weir C.C. and suggested that we set up a joint subcommittee as well as possible sources of funding, other local bodies that we could engage with, and that we identify owners of the path (possibly Elderslie Estates, who will confirm with me if they are the owners.)
- 7. Have arranged meeting with Derek MacKay, MSP on 1st July.
- 8. Our successful campaign to overturn the Local Government Boundaries Commission proposal to split Houston between two electoral wards was given an honourable mention in today's Gazette newspaper.
