### **Gryffe High School**

#### **Houston Community Council Update      20/09/2023**

- Scottish Government Insight data detailing school exam performance for this year was published today, the initial outlook is very favourable with Gryffe High School outperforming virtual comparator schools in almost every category from S4,S5 and S6.
- Gryffe High School 3Km fun run on Thursday 21 September 2023 – over 800 young people participating in support of the chosen charity, Cardiac Risk in the Young.
- Litter around the community remains an issue, we have a motivated team of S6 pupils who are implementing the litter picking rota around the community every day. Today they deep cleaned ‘Helicopter Park’, lifting lots of litter from the bushes on the hill.
- Following information obtained at the August HCC meeting regarding behaviour of young people in the community, the school is using PSE lessons to reinforce messages around substance misuse and the dangers.
- Vaping amongst young people is a concern nationally, and as a school we are seeking to be pro-active in educating young people of the dangers. The attractiveness of packaging and accessibility of vapes is proving to be a serious concern. High quality and relevant educational resources are key to delivering the correct message effectively.
- Houston Community Council member Duncan Greenhorn presented to over 120 6<sup>th</sup> year pupils in Gryffe High School regarding the work of the HCC and this was very well received. Young people in S6 have offered to come along to talk about their work at future HCC meetings, this idea was well received by those present.
