The project's main priority is the cycle path on Bridge of Weir Road where, assuming stakeholders agree, funding can be sought. Sustrans set out what is required for the cycle path, with RC drawing out the plan. He confirmed that Peter Leslie is still involved.	Note	
10.2	Renfrewshire Community Council Forum HCC/IA confirmed that Gavin Hutton Head of Operations and Service Development for Renfrewshire Council, attended the last meeting but the main topic discussed was the policy requiring payment for garden waste uplifts.	Note	
	It was confirmed that there will be a sticker on each brown bin to show that you have paid. HCC/TH asked if the costs versus benefits of this idea have been weighed up, with RC/AD confirming that evidence was taken. Initial fly tipping is predicted to stop, and fly tipped waste is likely to compost, minimising the problems caused. RC/AD reminded that the fee does not have to be paid, households can collaborate with neighbours, and those on a benefit such as pension credit can apply for a benefit licence. She also confirmed that food waste must be in

10.5	Smart Meters (Raised by HCC JMc) HCC/JMc confirmed that there is a strong chance SMES2 smart meters, the new system which allows transfer between companies, will not transfer the data they are required to in the Houston area. He also confirmed that there is no requirement from the government for energy companies to make them work, aside from British Gas. In many cases, gas meters can't communicate with electricity meters so gas meter data can't be sent. If your bill is accurate rather than an estimate, it means your smart meter is working properly. As this is a UK Government initiative, it was agreed for
